TREASURER'S REPORT



I'd like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Very Merry Christmas and to thank you all for your help, support and contributions over this past year.

For those of you that attended the AGM hoping for the Annual Financial Report I apologise that they were not ready. I realise that not everybody was able to attend the EGM that was held on Wednesday 29th so if there is anyone that would like a copy of the report please email or phone me and I will post or email them out to you (sandypartridge11@gmail.com or 01590 719858).

The good news is that both of our shows for 2016/2017 made a profit. Putting on the Glitz made a profit of £454 and Oklahoma made a profit of £1,466.

There are several elements that help our shows make a profit including ticket sales (encouraging family and friends to buy tickets, handing out flyers, dressing up and pacing the streets at the weekends leading up to the show at the Regent Centre), program advertising, Front of House (program selling, raffles, running a bar in the interval) and everything else that I can't think of whilst I'm writing this!

So I would like to say a big THANK YOU to you all from the bottom of my treasure chest (haha!) and sincerely hope that you will all continue to be involved. As the now well known saying goes..."Every little helps!"

Planning is well in hand for the show. In particular, Marketing is already getting going with box office now open and over 115 tickets sold at the time of writing. It is a good time of the year to bring the show to the attention of your family and friends for Christmas presents. Val Marples has done a sponsorship deal that will help with the show costs and leaflets/posters will be available at the first full company get-together on Wednesday 10th January.

As this is our anniversary production, I did not put a limit on numbers at the time of audition. So we are a large cast at 65 people. This makes it more difficult for me, but I wanted this to be a celebration as well as a show. I have already announced a draft allocation of the smaller parts, though I stress this was a draft, and it will change as we get going. I have also asked the cast for their absences, as the next task is to write a rehearsal schedule. This will be available after Christmas.

Work has begun on constructing a history of MMS to be published in the bumper size show programme. If you have any memories of the company, in particular the early days, please write them down and get them to Terry Barnett or myself ASAP. This anniversary programme will be supported by advertising. Val Marples is coordinating this, so please let her have any potential contacts the sooner the better.

I'm looking forward to starting the rehearsals and working with you all to produce a truly memorable show for our audiences, cast and production team. Have a great holiday break, as for the first part of the new year we are going to be rather busy!


"MY FAIR LADY" ~ the Producer's view








Milton Musical Society are pleased to announce their new show for Autumn 2018

Devised, written and directed by Les Del-Nevo, this production will continue to celebrate 50 years of the Society, and builds on the success of "Putting on the Glitz".



Synopsis

Having closed in America after a tragic death and prosecution for selling illicit alcohol, the "Top Hat" club moves to England in a bid to become respectable. The club opens on the 10th anniversary of the Great War in London on 11th November 1928.

In the first half of the show we watch the rehearsals for opening night developing over three scenes. Stories are entwined with appropriate songs and dance routines as characters fall in love, reminisce or go through their routines. Core to the story are three caretakers of the club, Fred, Bill and Bert, the club owner, Sam Bonetti and Pete the director. The female interest is Vera, the costume lady, Julie the choreographer, four dress makers, Freda, Mary, Ethel and Doris along with the Diva, Lotti Laverne. Two good comedy sketches take place as the club prepares for opening night

The twenty-one songs have plenty of scope for solos, group songs, backing singers, chorus work and a variety of dance routines.

After the interlude, the show progress to opening night at the "Top Hat" club. Whilst the cabaret continues we see action going on behind the scenes as a love story between the director Pete and the costume lady Vera ensues.

An intrigue between performer Harry and Lotti, the American prima donna, star of the show, adds a frisson of scandal. The Senior Sisters make a welcome return during their European tour. Drawing on songs from the Great American Songbook this fast moving, singing and dancing show will lighten the hearts of both those watching and performing.

The good thing about writing a show from scratch is that it can target our members' abilities, age ranges and the demographic of our audience.
